



K +teens

Students will work from our specially designed academic programme ideal for Young Learners. With tailored language lessons and study skills aimed at addressing our students' needs, this programme ensures all our learners progress with their language skills. The learning is not limited to the classroom, as students will be able to continue practicing their English with a social programme created to complement lessons learned in class.

There are 4 main aspects of our academic programme for Young Learners:

- *K +teens* course booklet
- *K +teens* My Diary
- Project lessons
- Excursion link lessons

***K +teens* COURSE BOOKLET**

Our *K +teens* course booklet is used in all classes from Elementary to Upper Intermediate level. Based on the communicative approach, it emphasises the use of English as a means of international communication rather than as an academic subject. In this way, classes focus on speaking the language and encourage students to communicate together with the aim of building the confidence to converse in English.

***K +teens* MY DIARY**

Each student receives a copy of *K +teens* My Diary to keep a record of their stay, write about their excursions and experiences, and practice their writing skills in an engaging and enjoyable way. Students will also be encouraged to set themselves a number of goals at the start of their course in order to challenge themselves throughout their study abroad experience. These goals are continuously reviewed as the course progresses, allowing them to measure their development and help them become more confident, independent learners.

PROJECT LESSONS

Each week, students work collaboratively in groups to produce a piece of work, including, but not limited to, a poster, leaflet, presentation, or video. Kaplan teachers will provide vocabulary and phrases that the students need to complete the project. The aim of the project lessons is to create a space for communication, where students will learn to discuss ideas, express themselves, and talk to each other in English. Teachers will provide students with feedback on their presentations.

EXCURSION LINK LESSONS

Excursion link lessons closely connect the academic programme to the social activities students take part in after class. During excursion link lessons, students will learn more about their destination and focus on the vocabulary they will need when visiting these destinations. Not only will students get excited about the places they are going to visit, but this will also enable them to get the most out of their trips.
